There is no time to slow down! With only 19 days to go, students need to continue to be organised and revise the content, key terms, and definitions from each subject they are studying. Teachers are providing opportunities throughout the week for targeted intervention as well as giving up their time during the Easter holidays to support all students so please encourage your child to attend.

Lastly, please ensure that your child has the relevant equipment to sit their exams - calculators make excellent gifts instead of Easter eggs!

### **Attendance**

We are acutely aware that the pandemic has caused massive issues in terms of both staff and student attendance at times over the last two years. However, as we move out of this period we need to focus once more on ensuring that student attendance is put right at the forefront of what we do as a school. Put simply, if students do not attend school, then they do not make the progress they should.

The diagram here illustrates this perfectly – there is a clear link between attendance and achievement. Even an attendance rate of 92-96% lowers the average GCSE grade by over half. Whilst we know that many students have struggled with Covid and other related issues, we are now going to be focusing closely on ensuring students' attendance returns to pre-Covid levels so that they are given the best possible chance of success in their time with us.

# **SEND** update

Exams access arrangements are available to students who struggle in exam situations due to an inability to access the material in some way. This might be an issue with reading, writing, or processing information. When a student has been identified as having such a difficulty, whether by staff, parents, or the student themselves, we will ask them to complete a selection of activities to determine which arrangement will provide them with the most appropriate support.

We do not need a formal diagnosis of learning difficulty and must complete these activities in house or through a qualified assessor known to the school. Once approved, arrangements will be valid for a period of up to 26 months.


