Inclusion team update

This half term has been incredibly busy within the Inclusion team. There has been a lot of work put into reviewing all aspects of Inclusion within school, from attendance and punctuality to behaviour and safeguarding. We have consulted staff and pupils as well as taking feedback from some parents and, as a result, Mr Clark will be contacting all parents in the final week of term to share some big changes we are making to our behaviour policy as we strive to ensure every lesson is free from any kind of disruption. In addition, attendance continues to be a top priority for the school – we are aware that there is a lot of illness around at the moment, but parents are reminded that attendance is one of the single biggest contributing factors towards pupil attainment. Simply put, if pupils are not in then they are not learning, and this will directly impact on their GCSE and KS5 grades. This includes punctuality to school – we have recently amended our policy to ensure that any pupil who is late to school is monitored and sanctioned appropriately, as again this has a massive impact on a pupil's progress in school. We are pleased to report that our renewed focus on behaviour and attendance this term has had a significant impact on reducing these incidences, but it is now our intention to continue to raise our expectations in order to give every pupil the best possible chance to perform to their potential.



Sport Specialism

It has been a busy T1 and T2 for the Sports Pupils at LeAF. Firstly, we are pleased to welcome both Mr Connolly and Mr Kowalczyk as experienced dual-career staff to our specialism. Mr Connolly comes from a professional rugby background as a player and continues to coach at the Bath Rugby DPP alongside teaching – LeAF will be fielding their first ever rugby team in the final week of term against Avonbourne, and we look to further the opportunities in rugby for our athletes in the coming months. Mr Kowalczyk recently graduated from Loughborough University with a Masters in Strength and Conditioning along with his undergraduate in Sports Science and brings further depth and knowledge to our elite athletes to further their marginal gains at the high levels they continue to compete.
