### Personal Development – Mr Jones .....

This academic year has seen real progress made in our personal development programme. This year our students have participated in three personal development days where the students have been engaged in workshops and sessions to equip them for life after school. They have looked at topics such as managing personal finances and understanding money, alongside developing IT skills and applying them in the context of the workplace. We also have speakers coming in the final week of term from The British Army, Royal Air Force, RNLI and many more to work with and alongside our students. Assemblies this year have been delivered weekly by both staff members and external organisations, such as Dorset Police on a range of themes, topics and community needs. In tutor sessions, students have consistently engaged in both PSHE and RSHE sessions and have been able to give feedback to us about their learning, so we can tailor it to their collective needs. I look forward to continuing to work with the rest of the team at LeAF, our other trust schools and the students into the next academic year.

## Performing Arts .....

We are extremely proud of this year's achievements in performing arts. We have performed and showcased at several events this year including An Evening With, Move It, CYD, Origins Dance and LeAF Live. #### Inclusion

It has been another very busy term for the Inclusion team. As well as dealing with all the usual matters at this time of year, we have been busy preparing our new Management Information System, Arbor, for a September launch. This means that from the new academic year we will be making some minor changes to our behaviour and attendance policies as we replace SIMS and will allow us to further support



students and parents in tracking and monitoring behaviour and attendance. In addition, the launch of our new core values – (PART – Passion, Ambition, Respect & Resilience, Teamwork) will mean an increased focus on positive rewards and you will notice that our achievement point categories will be changing in line with these new values as we embed them across every aspect of school life next year.

As always, attendance continues to remain a key priority for us as it is intrinsically linked to both academic and specialism success. From September, we will be launching a new online form for parents to request absences which will be available on the school website. This will replace the old paper form which students currently collect from reception and parents will need to complete this for any requested absence going forward. Our annual Awards Evening was another resounding success, with over 250 people attending, 200 people nominated and nearly 70 students and staff walking away with awards. Once again, a massive thank you to the Life Centre in Moordown for hosting us and all the Performing Arts students who sang so brilliantly on the evening. We had

an inspirational talk from LEAF alumni Johannes, as he spoke eloquently about his career since leaving LEAF and his 15,000km bike ride from China back to England. As always, it was wonderful to end the year with a celebration of all our students' wonderful successes and we look forward to seeing what fantastic achievements the new academic year will bring.



SEN support and needs are ever evolving and changing. The Local Authority are under increasing pressure to deliver assessments and services, which they are not achieving. Some waiting times for assessments have now been suggested to be around 4 years. The best way to support our young children during this time is to have links to some amazing charities and websites that offer guidance and practical support. I have attached these links to the bottom of this section.



This year, I am proud to state that we have modernized and strategically improved the implementation of SEND drastically. I have listed just a few of the main changes in our strategies and support offered:

1	All students identified with any learning need now have a pupil passport. Students and parents have been involved in the creation of these passports, which can be accessed online. Over 120 passports have been created within this academic year.
2	The rolling out of provision map across all sites has allowed all staff ease of access to teaching strategies and learning support for all students. This has improved staff's knowledge and ability to support students by creating an inclusive space.
3	Regular CPD has been offered throughout Leaf and partner sites improving the toolkits of all staff to support students with additional needs.
4	A complete modernization of how students are assessed for exam access arrangements has been undertaken meaning more students are successfully supported.
5	CAT testing has improved identification of needs for students joining us at Leaf and allowed us to highlight key areas of need throughout their journey.
6	ELSA ran by our dedicated and outstanding practitioner Sharon Regan has gone from strength to strength. Sharon supports so many of our students that have emotional needs and using provision map, we have managed to support a lot more students strategically throughout the academic year than ever before.
7	Communication and support for parents has been improved and strong relationships have been formed for our students with high levels of need. This is due to the ongoing proactive support of parents and the willingness to buy into the mantra that all students can achieve if given the right set of tools.

I am unfortunately leaving to pursue an alternative role within another setting at the end of this academic year. It has been nothing but a pleasure to do my upmost to move LeAF forward in a positive direction in supporting all students within additional needs. I am very proud of all the students I have supported during my time; I know they will continue to move forward in a positive direction.

## **Training Fund**

With ever increasing pressures on school budgets, we are now more than ever reliant on parental support through our Training Fund.
